siberia where he began dead house and some years in a disciplinary battalion in 1864 he lost first wife and his brother mihail he was in terrible poverty yet he took upon himself the payment of his brother s debts weighed down by debt he wrote at heart breaking speed and is said never to have corrected his work the later years of his life were much softened by the tenderness and devotion of his second wife in june 1880 he made his famous speech at the unveiling of the monument to pushkin in moscow and was received with demonstrations of love and honor a few months later he died he was followed to the grave by a vast multitude of mourners he is still probably the most widely read writer in russia in the words of a russian critic he was one of ourselves a man of our blood and our bone but one who has suffered and has seen so much more deeply than we have his insight impresses us as wisdom that wisdom of the heart which we seek that we may learn from it how to live
